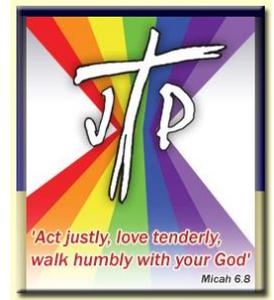

September opens Creation Time

"Creation is of the order of love. God's love is the fundamental moving force in all created things: "For you love all things that exist, and detest none of the things that you have made; for you would not have made anything if you had hated it" (Wis 11:24). Every creature is thus the object of the Father's tenderness, who gives it its place in the world. Even the fleeting life of the least of beings is the object of his love, and in its few seconds of existence, God enfolds it with his affection". (Laudato Si §77)

Creation time 1st September -4th October

Many parishes will have already responded to Pope's call to have September 1st as a day of prayer for creation; a reminder that all our efforts last year leading up to the Paris climate conference were not a one off, but, that our care of our common home is continuous. Maybe this time of creation might be a time to pray and consider the protection of human life. The Catholic Church's commitment to being pro-life is rooted in a "consistent ethic of life." This means that all life is sacred and has dignity from its beginning to natural death. There is nothing a person can do to forfeit this dignity. Being pro-life includes the promotion of public policy that protects life at every stage of development. Speaking up for the sanctity of all can sometimes be challenging today because of some of the scientific complexities. This month we have tried to put together a discussion paper to help groups look at this difficult subject.

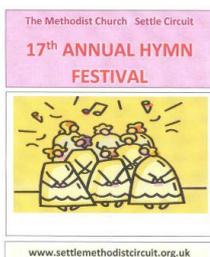
This day closes creation time – if you're brave enough you might like to consider the tradition blessing of animals' in church.
