Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Fr. James writes...

Recently, my cousin, Nicola invited me to the birthday party of her son, Jasper, on a Sunday. I sent my apologies saying that I'm afraid Sunday is my one work day of the week. This is not true, but sometimes it can look that way from the outside. Nina, Our Parish Centre Manager at Sacred Heart, suggested I shared a little about what I do as a Priest, as people may be interested and curious to see what a week in the life of a priest looks like. Below, I have outlined how my week was filled.

As Sunday, is a work day for priests, Friday is my day off. On this day, I try and slip away to rest and see friends and family. Last weekend, I was staying with the Dominican Sisters, in Sway, and also met with one of my supervisors who helps me to find as far as possible a healthy work / life balance and talk through the joys and challenges I may be facing in ministry.

<u>Saturday</u>

Saturday began with me celebrating Mass for the Sisters. I then drove back to St Edmunds, Horndean, for 8am as we were hosting an ecumenical breakfast and prayer session for Christian Churches. This was a wonderful occasion with over 30 Christians from local Churches. After Mass, I was available for Confessions then headed to visit Sarah Farrell, one of our School Catholic Chaplains and meet her beautiful new baby, Martha. I returned for a quick lunch and then prepared for my meeting with Steve Leigh at 4pm. We discussed the alpha away day and future plans. I then headed to the Church to assist Anthony in praying the Rosary and greet parishioners attending the 6:15pm Mass. I then had Supper with Fr Jeremy, said my night prayers and headed off to bed.

<u>Sunday</u>

Sunday, the day of the Resurrection is always a special day of the week. Fr Jeremy and I met in the Chapel at 7:15am for Adoration and prayed the office. We were joined by Ben the dog who has his own chair! On Sunday, we sing the psalms which we both enjoy. We sometimes make mistakes but help each other out when we do. We then have breakfast. I then headed to St Edmund's Horndean for 9am to meet and greet the Parishioners before the 9:30am Mass. After Mass, a quick cup of coffee and catch up then off to St Patrick's Hayling to celebrate the 11:30am Mass. I enjoy meeting the Parishioners after Mass. They are such a vibrant and joyful community. I also trained up two of the sacristans to receive Kandy into the Church, whose funeral was taking place the next day. After lunch with Jeremy, I had a little rest. At 4:30pm I joined

the training of our young leaders for this year's Confirmation group. This was led superbly by Hollie, our lead catechist. We are blessed to have 8 young leaders keen to inspire their peers! After training we then went to the Woodpecker for a drink and social. I returned at 9ish for prayers and bed.

Monday

I enjoy Monday mornings because it begins with Adoration at 7am and Mass at 7:30am. I love an early Mass. Anthony, one of our sacristans kindly sets up. Following Mass and breakfast, I connected with our staff who also serve in our Church; Nina, Sue and Lisa. Some Parishioners also on Mondays kindly clean the Church at this time, ably managed by Terry. Great to say hello to them. They do such great work. If you are free, new volunteers would be welcomed and greatly appreciated. They're a great team! In the early hours of Monday morning, I had received a call from a Catholic patient in the hospital who had given birth to a little baby, Hope. As very premature, the mum asked if I could come and baptise the baby. After breakfast I then headed into the hospital. (Monday is one of my 3 days where I am based in the hospital. I am contracted to serve there 15 hours a week) After baptising little Hope, only 12 hours old, I visited a number of patients with the sacraments. I then had a quick swim then returned for our Alpha course in the evening where our great team of over 20 volunteers welcomed our 30 guests who are keen to find out more about the Christian faith. At 9:30pm I returned home, said my prayers and went to bed.

<u>Tuesday</u>

On Tuesday morning I rose for an hour of prayer at 7am and prayed the Divine office of the Church with Jeremy. (As priests we promise to pray 5 times a day for all those in the Church) Sometimes, I do struggle on a Tuesday after a late night, the night before. After breakfast, I prepared for the funeral of Kandy that was taking place at 11am at St Patrick's. I am getting more confident in presiding at funerals but still find to prepare and make a homily personal cannot be rushed. The funeral went smoothly and after the burial I was invited to join the family for a light lunch at a local pub. I left at 1:45pm then returned to Waterlooville. A quick cup of tea at the house and then off to Oaklands for a meeting with Jess, the school chaplain, and Ben Knight, from One Church, to prepare together for our Mission day for Year 9 in two weeks' time. We had a great meeting from which we all left excited. I headed home for supervision at 5pm with my mentor in Cananda who is a real Godsend! I then prepared for All Saints Vigil Mass at 7pm at Horndean. Another joyful Mass. A cheeky curry on the way home and back for prayers and bed.

<u>Wednesday</u>

Prayers and breakfast as normal. I celebrated a 7:30am Mass for All Saints then had a special cooked breakfast with Fr Jeremy. When Sue arrived, Jeremy and I met with her to touch base about a few things. Communication is so important and sometimes we don't give enough time for this.... We're working on this! After this meeting, I headed into the hospital where I visited the sick. I caught up with Baby Hope and her family. I had also been told of other patients who would appreciate visits. Following these, I returned home. I spent some time preparing Sunday's homily then had a relaxing evening!

<u>Thursday</u>

Adoration and Morning Prayers as normal. After breakfast, checking of emails and admin then of to St Edmund's, Horndean, for Adoration and Mass. Following Mass, I had a conversation with Yvonne, the Parish administrator at St Edmunds to check all is well. A meeting then followed with Barry, the lead sacristan to discuss our new sacristans training we are delivering the following Saturday. A meeting with Lucia followed exploring how we can communicate all the exciting things going on in the Parish to old and new parishioners alike. Lucia kindly brought some lovely Minestrone Soup! I returned then to Waterlooville for admin and homily preparation for Sunday before slipping off early evening for my day off. Excited to be going to Woking to see a friend's show and then the next day, my day off, catching up with old friends!

A full, and jam-packed week! A rich and wonderful life.

I hope this gives you a little more of an idea of my life as a priest serving in Waterlooville, Horndean, Hayling and the Hospital. One apology I would like to everyone which I always feel guilty about... I know some people try and have important conversations with me on Sundays, but Sundays is not the ideal time. If you would like to speak to me, please, please book an appointment with Sue in the Sacred Heart office so these conversations can be given the time and attention they need. Both Fr Jeremy and I are available and want to be there to listen and help where we can. The office number at Sacred Heart is 02392 262289.

Thank you for all your support and patience in all the wonderful three communities in which I assist Fr Jeremy. Thank you for making me feel so welcome. I feel very blessed to here and try with the help of God's grace to serve you as best I can! Please keep me in your prayers.

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

Project applications recently received from Bamenda will be considered at the December Board of Trustees.

In 2024, we shall be celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the link, with Archbishop Andrew leading a delegation to Portsmouth for a week in July, visas permitting. CMA UK is also opening doors to Catholic men of other nationalities and cultures - some of the new members are from other countries such as Nigeria and Zimbabwe. There are now 13 dedicated members and more than 10 aspirants, all committed to active participation in the life of their respective parishes.

Supporting Teenage Single Mothers

The Archdiocesan Family Life Office was given a grant to run a project in 2022 to assist 70 teenage single mothers living in seven parishes in Bafut Deanery. The socio-political crisis and the imposition of spontaneous lockdowns impacted on the timescale of the delivery of the project, but it was successfully completed in November 2022 with the help of the members of the Family Apostolate Commission already operating in the Bafut Deanery and with the involvement of the Parish Priests with 100% of participants attendance recorded at all workshops and Automorphis -

The mothers attended group/individual counselling sessions, covering: challenges for a single mother and how to overcome them; positive parenting; moral and spiritual life of a single mother; the participation of teenage single mothers in the life of the Church: and the creation of support groups in parishes. Three Masses were celebrated, with five sessions for spiritual direction. Thirty of the mothers were selected to undergo training on the production of Supproved powder soap, which they completed successfully. Materials were provided to enable 26 of them to continue with the production and sale of powder soap. Four of them were given funding to help them complete their hairdressing and dressmaking training, which they had already started before the project. The mothers were encouraged to meet regularly to support each other. Many of them reported that the counselling and spiritual direction sessions had influenced changes in their lifestyle. The support groups continue in the parishes and more mothers are registering.

PPE for Health Personnel Dealing with Covid-19

Or Promise Aseh Munteh, the Health Co-ordinator of Catholic Health Services in the Archdiocese of Bamenda, submitted his report on the use and effect of the funding we had sent to provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for health personnel dealing with Covid 19 at the Catholic Health Centres and Hospitals throughout the Archdiocese.

The following supplies were purchased: medical face masks, examination gloves, aprons, hats, thermal flashes, hand sanitisers and hospital disinfectant.

Or Promise reported that the incidence of Covid 19 infection among health personnel decreased after the provision of PPE, which was much appreciated by the staff. The PPE gave them the confidence to treat patients with Covid. Following the project, they have sensitised both health personnel and the general public about steps to take to reduce the risk of contracting Covid 19.



Update from the Justice & Peace Commission



Last year, we funded a project to increase awareness of gender-based violence and how to combat it. Following the implementation of the programme, the Justice & Peace Commission has sadly received and managed 47 cases of gender-based violence in the first half of 2023. Sensitisation to the issue continues locally in communities.

In other work, the Commission has carried out prison monitoring visits and human rights monitoring and reporting. On 6 September, a new office for the Commission was opened in Mankon.

Youth Ministry Update

Youth Ministry activities continue to receive enormous support from the youth of the Archdiocesel There are opportunities at deanery and diocesan level to be involved in a variety of spiritual, social and physical activities from retreats, pilgrimages, spiritual formation, deanery rallies and summer camps to the Archbishop's Champions' League.



Spotlight on Ntenefor Mission Station:

When Fr Bernardine Nsom returned to Barnenda in October 2022, after serving us in the Portsmouth Diocese for nine years, Archbishop Andrew sent him to Ntenefor Mission Station to become Parish Priest of the new Parish of St Felix.

Before the Anglophone crisis, Ntenefor Mission Station was a rocky outcrop in a rural area on the outskirts of Bamenda town. A Catholic primary school, St Felix School, was built there with a capacity for 300 children.



Since the crisis began, the kidnapping and killing of people, particularly business people, civil servants and government officials, led to many people abandoning their homes and offices in other parts of the North-West Province and seeking refuge in Barnenda town, resulting in overcrowding, Many Internally Displaced People (IDPs) gravitated to the area of the Ntenefor Mission Station. With no end of the crisis in sight, the IDPs started to build homes in the neighbourhood and the population has risen to over 4,000, of whom 1,300+ are Catholics. This has in turn led to a significant rise in the primary school roll. to 650, over double the roll for which the school was built, resulting in very crowded classrooms - 75 children in the nursery class and 97 Primary children in one classroom!

The teachers and popils have been soldiering on and it is hoped that the school will be rebuilt or extended.

Archbishop Andrew visited in December 2022 to celebrate the official opening of St Felix Parish. There are daily Masses in the main parish church and two Masses on Sunday with over 1,200 Mass attendance.





Soon after arriving in the parish, Fr Bernardine started inviting students in his parish who were attending local public and private colleges which are not Catholic, to come to the Church for a Mass and to give him the opportunity to get to know them and discover how the parish could assist them as part of the Catholic family of Ntenefor. There was a good response with 130 attending! Many of them were IOPs.

The parish has been pulling together and developing plans for the long-term future of the site. There is no presbytery, so Pr Bernardine has been living in a house about two miles away from the church and the school, which has been generously provided for him by a friend until a presbytery can be built. Plans have been drawn up to build a presbytery, a parish hall, a larger school, some low-cost houses for rental, some shops, and offices for rental, which will combine to generate an income for the parish in the future, helping it to become self-reliant. There is also a need for toilets in the main parish church.

There is an acute water shortage in Bamenda – the water facility has not been updated and the town's population keeps increasing. Poor government policies on the environment in the past have resulted in deforestation, which has reduced the amount of water going into the soil. Most rainwater is lost through run-offs. Ntenefor is hilly and the water pressure is low. During the dry season, there is very little or no water. Wells and boreholes are needed.



Since the end of the last dry season, the parish has cleared the tough grass from around the site, tilled and levelled the ground to enable the planting of trees and turf to improve the environment and enable rainwater to be absorbed into the ground rather than running off.

Focus on Fundraising:

In the last financial year ending 31 August 2023, our main source of income remained our arrural Barnenda Sunday Appeal. Thank you for your generous donations, whether they were through a standing order or the second collection in your parish or via our Give As You Live page, which can be accessed via our website at www.barnendaandportsmouth.com/donate.php.

We would like to thank the Jersey Catenian Circle for their continued generosity, raising £2,098 for Barnenda this year from their Circle. Funds were also raised across the Diocese during the year in a number of ways, which might give YOUR community some ideas for 2023-24:

Bake Sale in Guernsey

Last year, Bamenda Sunday coincided with a cake sale arranged by the pupils of St Mary & St Michael Primary School to raise funds for their school after the Mass at Our Lady Star of the Sea in Guernsey.

However, after they heard Liz Dene, a member of the Portsmouth Barnenda Committee, give the Barnenda Sunday Appeal and how just £30 would pay school fees for a pupil at a rural primary school for a year in the Archdiocese of Barnenda, they asked their head teacher, Helen Willetts, if the money they'd raised, £103.02, could be sent to Barnenda instead to pay the school fees for 3 primary school children to attend school - many thanks for their generosity and inspiring example of selflessness!



Learning about Bamenda Life

St Edmund's Catholic Secondary School, Portsmouth is twinned with St John Paul II Comprehensive College (JOPACC), Wurn. academic year, Year 8 in St. Edmund's learns about Catholic Social Teaching in their RE lessons and is taught about their sisterschool in Bamenda. Students had no idea what the day would hold for them but arrived enthusiastic and willing to support in any way they could. They had been encouraged to wear a colour to represent the Green, Red and Yellow of the Cameroon Flag to show their support.

During the day, students completed activities studying Bamenda, learning about the difficulties the people face daily and the life they live. Students designed the city of Bamenda, considering amenities they would include within a set budget, focusing on education, clean water and safe homes. They produced excellent cities and also wrote postcards for the children of one of the local schools.

Students spent the last hour running laps of the school playground to raise money from sponsorships of how far they could go. As a year group, they raised \$412.21 - a great effort! St Edmund's looks forward to continuing to support JOPACC every year at school!

"Walk to Barnenda!"

We are also grateful to our Guernsey Community for another great fundraising initiative, engaging parishioners of all agest

When Fr Gaston was an Assistant Priest in Guernsey, he promoted consideration of Laudato Si initiatives, drawing to the attention of parishioners the plight of communities in Bamenda affected by deforestation and without access to a clean water supply, encouraging them to consider raising money for a borehole to provide a water source for portable water on the Ntenefor Mission Station, described overleaf.

In Lent 2023, Guernsey parishioners undertook a sponsored walk around the island, equivalent to walking to Barnenda! This amazing effort raised £10,200 to be split equally between Barnenda to support their brothers and sisters at \$1 Felix Parish, Ntenefor, and CAFOD. Congratulations and sincere thanks to all the participants, including Frinna, Assistant Priest, who raised some £3,000 in sponsorship!



Challoner Celebrates Diversity 2023!

Mrs Teresa Cripps, Chaplain at Bishop Challoner School, Basingstoke writes:

"It was a joy and a privilege to be part of our into evening celebration of our Diversity superpowers here at Bishop Challoner on the 15th June. From amazing cultural dresses and dances, to herma, Polish crafts and inspiring spoken words – it was a day to remember and hold onto. Songs and dances from around the world, plus music on the piano and even a chance to vote for the Best British Biscuit; it was all there. In the evening, we had the additional joy of a variety of world foods, all eagerly enjoyed by students and families alike. A huge thank you to all who made this possible!"

Some of the day's activities allowed students to raise muchneeded funds for our sister-school, St Bede's College in Ashing Kom, totalling £753.

For the first time at Bishop Challoner, we held a cultural runway, which involved anyone aligned with a different nation joining with others to walk (accompanied by a cultural song of their choice) across the red carpet, onto the stage and off again.
