
Pentecost Sunday

Fr. Jeremy writes... ICONS

Today we begin a short series on icons and their place in the worship practices of the Church, most especially their importance in the Orthodox tradition and in Eastern Christianity. We will look at them particularly in relation to the forthcoming great feasts of the Church: Pentecost, Trinity, Corpus Christi, Sacred Heart and Sts Peter and Paul.

We are most familiar with icons, I guess, as those symbols on our computer desktops which indicate particular functions or apps and which lead us into the specific and varied activities offered by our computer's menu. This is not a million miles away from the icon's original purpose in a worship setting where the icon is a holy venerated image, a focus for prayer and contemplation which can act as a kind of portal, leading the worshipper deeper into the realm of the sacred and mystical.

Anyone who has visited an Orthodox Church will immediately notice the iconostasis, a wall covered in icons built across the body of the building separating the worshippers from the clergy and behind which all the liturgical services take place. The visitor will also notice that many of the icons are richly decorated or covered in embossed silver, and that there are often worshippers praying in front of them, kissing them, lighting candles before them or bowing reverently towards them; at various moments during a Mass, a member of the clergy will emerge from behind the icon screen to incense the icons. Icons are sacred images and attract almost the same reverence in the Eastern Church as the Blessed Sacrament. They have often had miraculous powers associated with



them and will be brought to the sick room of those who are ill or close to death in the hope of healing them or helping their transition to the next world. One observer travelling through what we now call Russia in the 17th century observed; "they attribute a power to the pictures as though these could help to bring about something particular. They will dunk a picture into their beer, for example, when they are brewing, in order that the brew may succeed."

Icons are also a very particular kind of religious art form with very strict conventions about how they are made, how the wooden panels are carefully prepared after much prayer and reflection by the iconographer, how clothing, features, landscapes and wording are stylistically represented in the image, and how certain colours convey certain moods and meanings. This can be seen in the icon portraying the Day of Pentecost above. Here the apostles are seated in heaven to receive the flame of the Holy Spirit. They are all painted the same size in spite of the perspective to show that they are all of equal status, apart from Peter and Paul, the two at the top of the two columns, who are painted very slightly larger because of their special importance in the life of the Church. Of course, Paul was not originally present, and nor were Mark and Luke, the evangelists who are also among the group, but, again, their importance in carrying out the work of the Holy Spirit in spreading the Christian Gospel earns them their place here. The evangelists are pictured holding books, symbols of the Gospels, while the other apostles carry scrolls. The gap between Peter and Paul immediately tells us that the place occupied by Jesus is now vacant since he has ascended back to the Father.

The kingly figure in the panel at the bottom symbolises the world. A 17th century description reads, "The man [stands] in a dark place, since the whole world had formerly been without faith; he is bowed down with years, for he was made old by the sin of Adam; his red garment signifies the devil's blood sacrifices; the royal crown signifies sin, which ruled the world [as a tyrant]; the white cloth in his hands with the twelve scrolls means the twelve Apostles, who brought light to the whole world with their teaching."

News from St. Peter's School

Headteacher, Richard Cunningham writes...

You may have read, heard or seen in the news this week the grand proclamation that "children under 9 are to be banned from receiving sex education", including plans to prohibit any pupils being taught about gender identity. In truth, sex education is not typically taught in most primary schools until Year 6, when the children are aged 10 or 11, and is delivered at an age-appropriate and introductory level centred on pregnancy

and child birth. Further and appropriate sex education follows at secondary school age, and parents and carers always have the right to withdraw their children of any age from sex and relationships education (but not the biological aspect of reproduction that appears in the science national curriculum).

It is also worth noting that in primary schools, what is meant by 'relationships' education involves teaching children what makes a good friend, who are trusted adults, how to sort out arguments, and how make up after disagreements. Throughout primary school, children are taught about healthy, respectful relationships, focusing on family and friendships - including online and social media. This primary school content at St Peter's is all age appropriate and does not venture into what some of the mainstream media may have you believe is radical teaching on adult relationships, gender identity and sexual orientation. Furthermore, children are taught at the right age and stage about some of the physical changes that will happen to them during their later childhood and early adolescence as part of the curriculum about maintaining their own personal health and wellbeing. You will be reassured to know that St Peter's relationships and health education curriculum is taken from a Diocesan approved programme of study called 'Life to the Full', prepared and resourced by a Catholic company called Ten:Ten. This is a programme underpinned by a Christian faith understanding that our deepest identity is as a child of God - created, chosen and loved by God. Furthermore, St Peter's Relationships and Sex Education policy is publicly available on our school website, giving further reassurance to parents, carers and families of how our school approaches these sensitive topics in the most suitable way for the pupils in our care. At all times, we respect the role of parents and carers as the first educators of their children.

I am always available to host any conversations that parents, carers or families, having the policies and curriculum above, may still wish to have regarding relationships and health education at St Peter's. I would also advise caution when reading about this topic in the media, encouraging individuals to conduct their own research as to just how representative headline grabbing stories may be of the reality in the vast majority of our schools.
